## **Newsletter Edition 4: 28 August 2015**

This is the fourth e-newsletter intended to keep subscribers informed of the implementation of the HIV SA program.

The team commenced work on Monday 17 August, and the week began with the team rebranding HIV SA to SAMESH (SA \* Mobilisation + Empowerment for Sexual Health). The SAMESH team have a new vision of community engagement for sexual health and wellbeing. The visual brand takes its identity from the iconic HIV/AIDS awareness ribbon as the basic component, with the shape being refined to a simpler graphic to allow for flexibility in the design. The shape has then been inverted to symbolise V for 'victory', and finally the circle is added to provide focus to suggest an abstract figure of movement and action. It further emphasises that people are at the centre of SAMESH and reinforces the purpose of the program, that of mobilisation and empowerment of community. The M acknowledges the partnership between SHine SA and VAC in overseeing SAMESH; it further reinforces the idea of meshing, integration, linkages and partnerships, all central to the SAMESH team's aim of effective and meaningful community engagement.

Procurement of the city office is expected to be confirmed within the next two weeks. An announcement will be made through SAMESH social media platforms, the rainbow network and Feasters. SAMESH will be operating from the Karrparrinthi Aboriginal Health & Wellbeing Centre at 51 Bower Street, Woodville until the city site becomes available.

The counsellor's position has been offered to Mr Robert Willoughby, and we offer our congratulations to Robert and welcome him to the SAMESH team.

- The SAMESH website will be active from 28 August as will be the new SAMESH Facebook page.
- The Drama Down Under Spring Campaign has begun with a full-page advert in September's issue of Blaze and a half-page advert promoting our new Get PEP campaign.
- The SAMESH team have been in Melbourne for two days receiving Rapid HIV Testing Training (RHT), and SAMESH will provide peer-based RHT from the city site.
- The HIV positive peer support worker has met with Clinic 275, RAH and Flinders Medical Centre staff to establish a peer-based support service for newly diagnosed HIV positive people.
